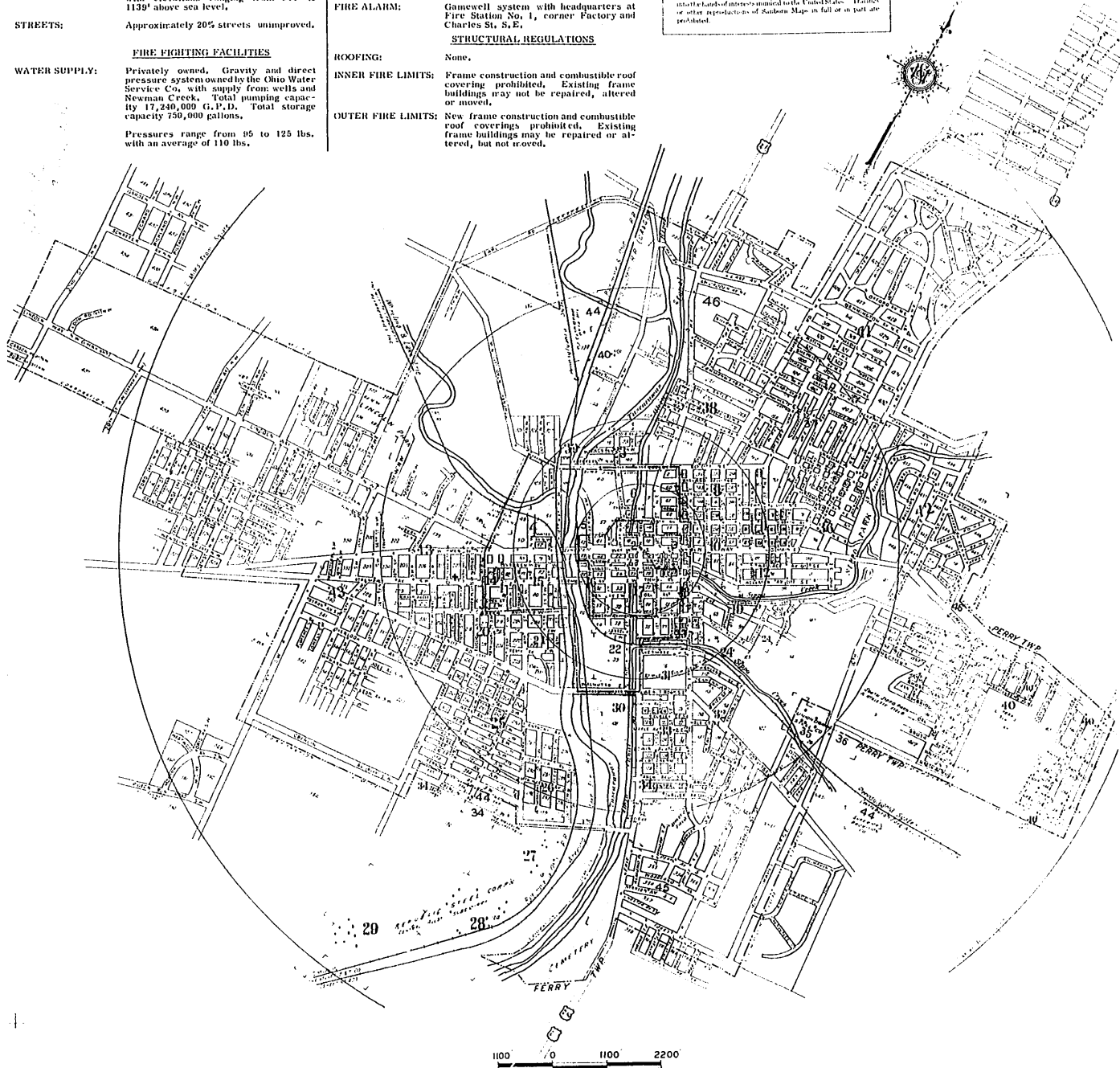
POPULATION: 29,594 (1950 U.S. Census).
METEOROLOGY: Prevailing winds S.W. High winds moderately frequent. Winter temperatures moderately severe. Extended periods of hot dry weather are few.
TOPOGRAPHY: Surface and grades are slightly rolling with elevations ranging from 943' to 1139' above sea level.
STREETS: Approximately 20% streets unimproved.

Average daily consumption 2,300,000 gallons.
FIRE DEPT.: Fully paid with 1 chief and 38 firemen, 3 stations.
FIRE ALARM: 5 combination pumper, hose and booster trucks, 1 aerial ladder truck.
FIRE ALARM: Gamewell system with headquarters at Fire Station No. 1, corner Factory and Charles St, S.E.

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FIRE FIGHTING FACILITIES
 Privately owned. Gravity and direct pressure system owned by the Ohio Water Service Co. with supply from wells and Newnan Creek. Total pumping capacity 17,240,000 G.P.D. Total storage capacity 750,000 gallons.
 Pressures range from 95 to 125 lbs. with an average of 110 lbs.

STRUCTURAL REGULATIONS
ROOFING: None.
INNER FIRE LIMITS: Frame construction and combustible roof covering prohibited. Existing frame buildings may not be repaired, altered or moved.
OUTER FIRE LIMITS: New frame construction and combustible roof coverings prohibited. Existing frame buildings may be repaired or altered, but not moved.



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
